PROPER FLAG CONDUCT

Conduct by members of the Armed Forces, Veterans out of uniform and all persons present during Hoisting, Lowering, or passing a flag.

Section 9 of Title 4, United States Code has been amended to say, "Those present in uniform should render the military salute. Members of the Armed Forces and veterans who are present, but not in uniform may render the military salute. All other persons present should face the flag and stand at attention with their right hand over the heart, or if applicable, remove their headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand over the heart. Citizens of other countries should stand at attention. All such conduct toward the flag in a moving column should be rendered at the moment the flag passes.
